Policy	Summary of Changes
<p><a href="#">PTS 101</a> Parking Permit Sales and Vehicle Registration</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to change the title; to add a source and a cross-reference; and to state that "ARS §28-2001 requires that all Arizona residents must obtain Arizona vehicle registration unless he/she is a student or a member of the active military service assigned to the Department of Military Science or the Department of Aerospace Studies. All vehicles, regardless of the state registered, must acknowledge compliance with the State of Arizona Emissions Standards in order to receive a university parking permit to park on campus"</p>
<p><a href="#">PTS 102</a> Temporary Parking Permits</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to include that temporary one-day permits may be purchased using online services or at the Parking and Transit Services offices</p>
<p><a href="#">PTS 105</a> Replacement of Lost, Damaged, or Stolen Permits and Gate Access Cards</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to include transit permits and also to state that one must return remnants of damaged parking permits if possible</p>
<p><a href="#">PTS 301</a> Parking Citations</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to update the Parking Violation Codes and to state that "PTS may increase the amount for certain citations to provide a deterrent to repeat offenders; a current accumulation schedule is available at the PTS Web site. Various citations may not be appealed as they are considered fines or fees" and that "Late fees are added to unpaid citations. After 120 days delinquent, unpaid citations are eligible to be turned over to a collections agency"</p>
<p><a href="#">PTS 302</a> Loading Zones</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to state that vehicles may be permitted to park for longer than the 20-minute time limit with prior approval from PTS</p>
<p><a href="#">PTS 303</a> Towing of Illegally Parked Vehicles</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to state that a vehicle is subject to being towed without warning if unauthorized vehicles are tailgating into or out of a parking structure or lot to avoid payment in a visitor lot, and that a dean's referral may be issued for students who commit any violations or repeat violations as listed</p>
<p><a href="#">PTS 501</a> Commuter Options Program</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to include Downtown Phoenix campus express shuttle service between all campuses and to delete the single shuttle service between Tempe and Downtown Phoenix campuses</p>
<p><a href="#">PTS 601</a> Transit Services</p>	<p><b>Revision of Policy</b> Revised to include Downtown Phoenix Campus express shuttle service between all campuses and U-Pass options and policies for students; to state that notices will also be posted at bus stops when routes/times are altered, and that ASU and its vendors/contractors are not responsible for items left on the shuttles</p>
