

Manzanita Village Residence Hall

Manzanita Village is located on the west side of the main campus and includes seventeen three- and four-story residential buildings with scenic views of the ocean, lagoon, or campus. Each building houses approximately 45 guests in single- and double-occupancy rooms and includes a lobby area, laundry/vending room, lounge with terrace, and study room. Several buildings feature kitchenettes for guest convenience.

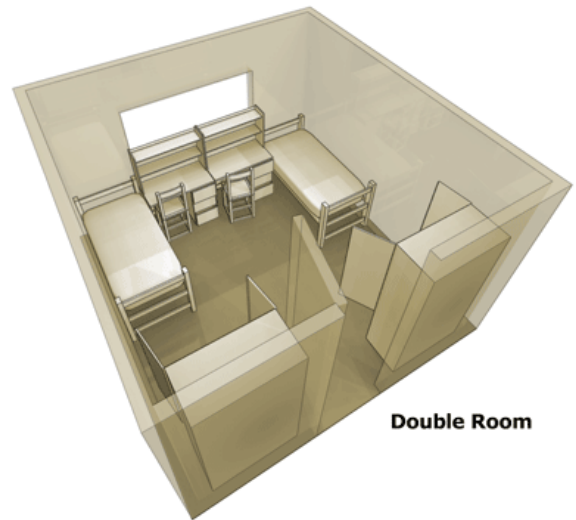


Walking Times

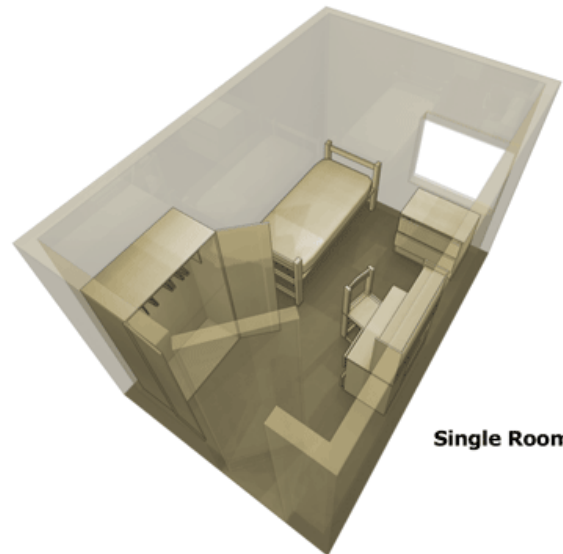
Beach	4 minutes

Amenities:

- Rooms open onto a main hallway with single-gender bathrooms nearby (1 bathroom per 4 residents). Guests may wish to bring a robe and shower shoes.
- Rooms are furnished with one or two single beds, desks, desk chair, small chest of drawers and a closet. (Rooms do not have telephones, televisions, radios or clocks.) Guests may wish to bring a reading lamp.
- Each building has a lounge with a television for guest use.
- Wireless Internet access
- Laundry facilities
- Lounge phones are available for local and credit calling card calls. There are no phones in individual rooms.

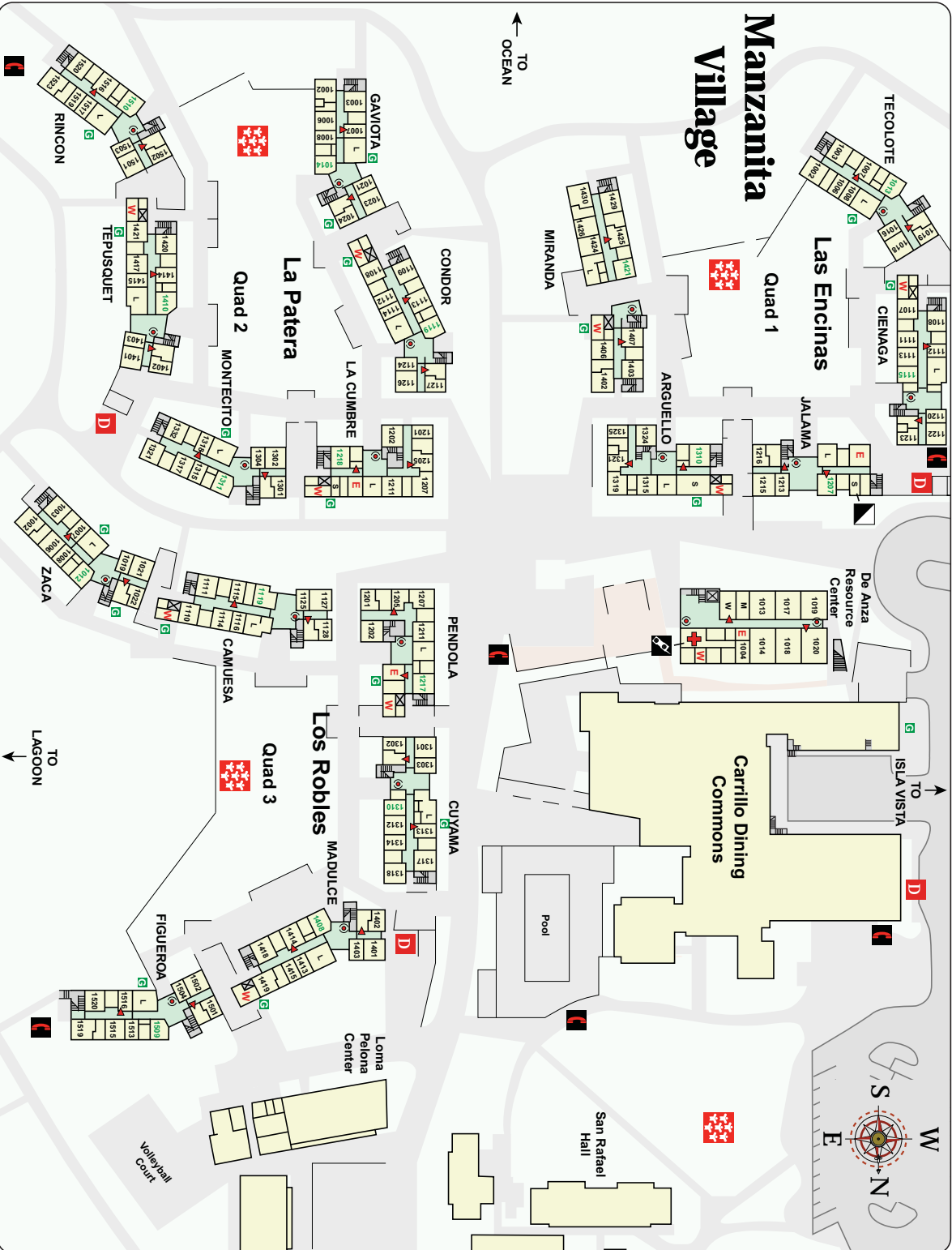
