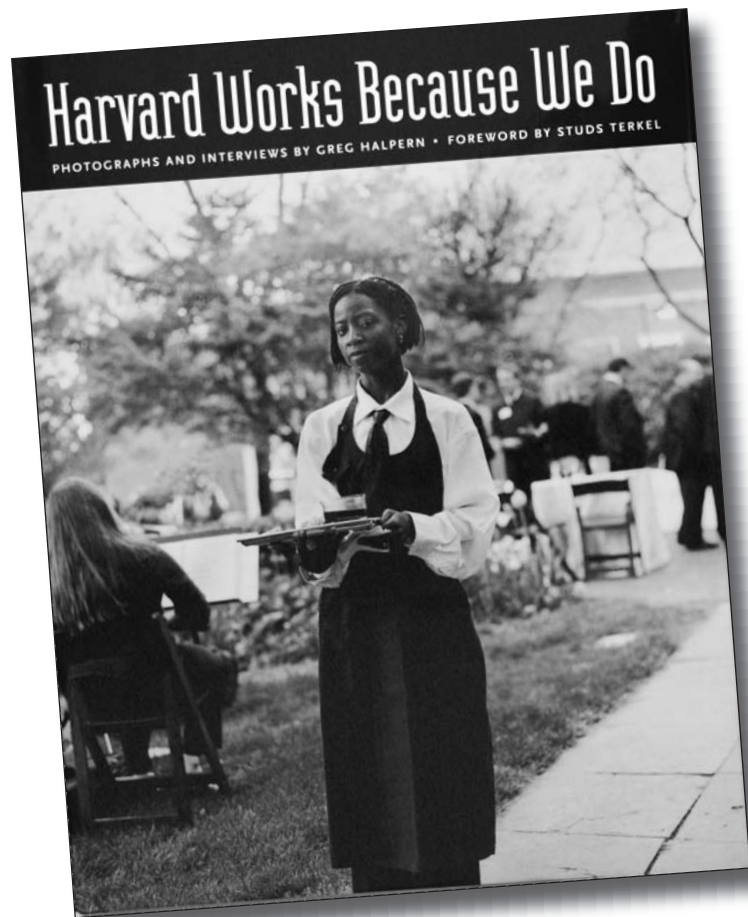
The Campus Environment Team (CET) is sponsoring a panel discussion with **Greg Halpern**, a critically acclaimed author and photographer of “Harvard Works Because We Do.”, which documents his efforts to convince Harvard University to pay its service workers a livable wage. His work has been reviewed in several publications, including Publisher’s Weekly and the New York Times Book Review. In 1998 Halpern worked with the Harvard Living Wage Campaign to pressure Harvard University to improve the standard of living of its workers. In 2001, a major settlement was reached, and Harvard agreed it would no longer pay outsourced workers – those hired through contractors – less than workers it hired directly. In addition, the city of Boston raised its minimum wage, other universities raised their pay scales, and Living Wage campaigns were started up on more than two dozen other campuses.

In addition to **Halpern**, panelists include: **Carah Campini**, an ASU honors student studying socio-culture anthropology with a minor in African/African American studies and is involved in the Social Justice and Living Wage Coalitions; **Jarrad Henderson**, an ASU photography student active in various organizations including African American Men of ASU and STARS (Students Taking Action to Reach Success); and **Brendan Walsh**, a graduate of Harvard and Yale, and the local director of UNITE HERE, a union that represents nearly a half million individuals working in industries such as hotels, casinos, restaurants and food service. The panel moderator is **Meg McConnaughy**, program coordinator for ASU West Communications Assessment and Learning Lab.
