#### LANGUAGE REQUIREMENT

At least two years of a Southeast Asian language is required at the college level. Students are encouraged to study beyond the second-year level, especially if participating in an exchange program where the language of instruction is in a language other than English. This requirement may also be met through one of the following ways:

- A. Two years, or above, of a Southeast Asian language, each with a minimum grade of C.
- B. Participating in a year-long study abroad or exchange program to a Southeast Asian country where students study the language at the intermediate level or above.
- C. With a proficiency test confirming student's proficiency allows continuation in the third year of the language.
