ABC Political Science. Pre-publication tables of contents for about 300 international journals in the fields of political science, government, law, economics and sociology. Printed version covers 1969-present. Also available at Eisenhower on CD-Rom.

American Historical Association, *Guide to Historical Literature*, 3rd ed., 2 vols. (1995). The basic principle of organization is geographic, with some reliance on topical and chronological subdivisions. The geographic sections include brief overviews of scholarly trends, and helpful annotations; some also include guides to reference works and bibliographies. SAIS

Annotated List of Reference Websites (Library of Congress). Still under development; covers many fields of the social sciences and humanities.

BBC Worldwide Monitoring: International Reports. The BBC's Monitoring Service systematically tracks broadcasts from 120 countries in 50 languages. The Summary of World Broadcasts (SWB) was a separate part of the service until the end of March 2001, when it was discontinued. After that date the information previously carried in the SWB became part of the International Reports. Accessible through LexisNexis.

Book Review Digest. Indexes reviews appearing in about 100 periodicals; includes brief excerpts. Accessible through the SAIS library homepage.

Books in Print. The on-line version includes full text reviews from *Choice*, *Library Journal*, *New York Times*, and other review sources. Accessible through the SAIS library homepage.

CIAO [Columbia International Affairs Online]. Allows search-engine access to working papers from a wide range of think tanks and to tables of contents and article abstracts from the most recent issues of about 35 international-affairs journals. Also contains information on forthcoming scholarly conferences in international affairs. Available via the library homepage.

Digital Dissertations. A comprehensive list of American dissertations that begins in the mid-19th century. Citations for dissertations published since 1980 include a short abstract written by the author. Full text of titles published since 1997 is available on-line to institutional subscribers. Accessible via the library homepage.

Eureka. Provides online access to over 20 million records representing the holdings of major U.S. research libraries. Books, archives, manuscripts, and other special files are included. Accessible via the library homepage.

Find It. This link on the library webpage enables you to determine JHU's bibliographic or full-text electronic holdings of particular journals.

Fulltext Sources Online. A systematic list of periodicals available on-line in full text, along with the names of the data bases that contain them. Includes foreign- as well as English-language periodicals. Some data base aggregators, such as JSTOR and

- International Bibliography of the Social Sciences*. Contains bibliographic information from over 2,600 journals published in 100 countries and over 6,000 books per year, in the fields of anthropology, economics, political science, and sociology. Coverage is from 1951 to present, with quarterly updates. Accessible via the library homepage.
- International Political Science Abstracts*. Provides citations and abstracts for a world-wide selection of journal and yearbook articles in the fields of international relations, political science, and public administration. Online coverage: 1989 to present. Accessible via the SAIS Library home page.
- Internet Scout Project*. (<http://scout.wisc.edu>). Tracks useful websites and assesses their intellectual reliability. The Scout Report Archives is a searchable and browseable database of over seven years' worth of the [Scout Report](#) and subject-specific Scout Reports. It contains about 12,000 critical annotations of carefully selected Internet sites and mailing lists. Each annotation analyzes the site's general content, attribution (authors, etc.), currency, availability, accessibility, and presentation. Accessible via the library homepage.
- JSTOR*. Reproduces the full image of over 117 scholarly journals, starting in each case with volume 1. The purpose is to provide an archival collection of core scholarly journals, not current access; most articles are at least two years old. Full text searching is available. Runs of additional titles are gradually being added to the database. Accessible via the library homepage.
- LexisNexis*. Provides the full text of hundreds of publications, including law journals, wire services, country economic reports, government publications, magazines, newspapers, news digests, and industry newsletters and periodicals.
- Library of Congress Catalog*. The LC is arguably the world's most comprehensive library. Its webpage includes links to the catalogs of several hundred other research libraries, primarily in North America, the UK, and Australia. Available at <http://catalog.loc.gov/>

- NetFirst*. Indexes and describes selected Internet-accessible resources, with a focus on sites of interest to libraries and the education community. Accessible via the library homepage.

PolicyFile: Public Policy Research and Analysis. Indexes and abstracts publications covering a complete range of public policy research from such organizations as the American Enterprise Institute, Brookings Institution, Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, IMF, World Bank, CSIS, Rand Corporation, and many others. Where available, access to home pages and full text is provided. Accessible via the library homepage.

Project MUSE. Includes the full image of all articles in over 100 scholarly journals, including all JHU Press journals. Full text searching as well as subject searching is available. Accessible via the library homepage.

Public Affairs Information Service (PAIS). A selective listing, with abstracts, of journal articles, books and documents. Subjects include economics, business, political science, sociology, demography, and international law and relations, with an emphasis on public-policy oriented literature. Includes titles published in six languages. Accessible via the library homepage.

Public Opinion and Polling around the World: A Historical Encyclopedia, 2 vols. (2005[?])

Reader's Guide to the Social Sciences. Ed. Jonathan Michie. 2 volumes. (2001). SAIS *Social Science Information Gateway* (<http://sosig.esrc.bris.ac.uk/>). A guide to a large number of online scholarly sites screened by experts. Includes breakdowns by anthropology, economics, geography, politics, sociology, and other fields. Oriented primarily toward British scholarship.

Social Sciences Full Text. An index to English-language periodical articles. Subjects include anthropology, area studies, economics, international relations, law, political science, and sociology. Online coverage from February 1983, with abstracts from January 1994, and some full text articles. Accessible via the library homepage.

Ulrich's Periodicals Directory on the Web. Use this source to compile a comprehensive list of periodicals by subject and to find essential information about individual periodicals published worldwide: where a title is indexed, online availability, whether it is refereed and contains reviews and more. Gives users links to tables of contents, some article abstracts, some journal full-text, and document delivery. Click on the "search" button at the top of the initial screen to take advantage of full search capabilities. Accessible via the library homepage.

Web of Knowledge. This source includes five databases covering virtually all fields of knowledge. Two of the most useful are the *Social Sciences Citation Index (SSCI)* and the *Arts & Humanities Citation Index (A&HCI)*. These databases are a powerful means of discovering networks of scholarly articles relevant to your particular research interests. Beginning with any article that you have found valuable, you can locate all subsequent journal articles that cite it. In other words, this resource allows forward as well as retrospective bibliographic searching.

The *SSCI* provides access to current information and retrospective data from 1956 forward. Fields covered include Anthropology, History, Library Science, Law, Linguistics, Philosophy, Psychology, Political Science, Public Health, Sociology, Urban Studies, and Women's Studies. *SSCI* adds approximately 60,000 new cited references per week. As of January 1992, it contains searchable, full-length, English-language author abstracts for approximately 60% of the articles in the index. The *A&HCI* provides access to current information and retrospective data from 1975

forward. Fields covered include Archaeology, Architecture, Art, Asian Studies, Folklore, History, Language, Linguistics, Philosophy, Radio/Television/Film, Religion, and Theater. *A&HCI* adds approximately 15,250 new cited references per week. As of January 2000 *A&HCI* contains searchable, full-length, English-language author abstracts (as available) for the new articles entered into the index.

Registering for *Current Contents Connect*, also part of the Web of Knowledge, allows you to set up a personal alerting profile for journals that you select. This profile automatically emails you the latest tables of contents for your chosen journals as they appear. Registering also enables you to set up citation alerts that notify you when future articles cite key articles you have found to be of special interest. *Current Contents Connect* includes a personal home page that displays all your selected titles and allows you to see the latest table of contents by clicking on a title. The Web of Knowledge is accessible via the library home page.

World News Connection. Provides English-language translations of material from thousands of non-U.S. media sources. Included are political speeches, television and radio broadcasts, and articles from newspapers, periodicals, and books. Online coverage: 1996 to present. Accessible via the library homepage. For earlier coverage, see the *Foreign Broadcast Information Service Index*.

Working Paper Sites of Political Science (workingpapers.org). A directory for college and university instructors and independent researchers with a Ph.D., who distribute their working papers online via a link to their personal website.

WorldCat. The world's most comprehensive bibliography. It covers virtually all the material cataloged by any of several thousand member libraries, including books, serials, archival materials, maps, visual materials, computer files, and Internet resources. It allows you to determine which libraries in the DC, Maryland, and neighboring states own a particular title. Accessible via the library homepage.
