

Integrated Studies: Classical Studies Major

In order to enter the Integrated Studies program, students must have already completed 32 credit hours and hold at least a 3.25 overall GPA. Additionally, students are required to submit 3 letters of recommendation from professors. The Integrated Studies major consists of a minimum of 42 credit hours, 21 of which must be from the 300 or 400 level.

Applications should include a letter of intent to major in Classical Studies through the CLAS Integrated Studies program, a copy of your transcript, and the names of the three professors you have asked to recommend you. Your application and your professors' letters should be sent to:
