Dr. Melnick has been the Director of the Morrison Institute for Public Policy – Arizona’s oldest “think tank” – at Arizona State University (ASU) since 1987 and holds an academic appointment as research scientist in the School of Public Affairs. He is also ASU's Associate Vice President for Economic Affairs and Public Policy. Immediately prior to his work for Morrison Institute, Dr. Melnick was a senior fellow and vice president of the Hudson Institute where he was in charge of policy studies on employment and education. In addition to his administrative responsibilities, Dr. Melnick conducts research on urban growth management, education reform and economic development. He is the co-author of three books on these subjects and frequently contributes to the Institute's policy research studies. Most recently, he was a principal author of major reports entitled *Growth and the Future of Greater Phoenix*, *Enriching Arizona's Knowledge Economy*, and *Seeds of Prosperity: Public Investment in Science and Technology Research*. As Associate Vice President for Economic Affairs, Dr. Melnick frequently interacts with the senior leaders of major technology and innovation businesses such as Google, Honeywell, General Dynamics, Qwest and Motorola. He has been appointed to numerous government commissions and task forces on a wide range of public policy and economic development issues.
