


Nonprofit Leadership & Management

Area of interest: Nonprofit Leadership and Management

This search supports our current nonprofit emphasis area and will expand the reach and reputation of ASU as curricular programs expand. We are searching for an individual with expertise in nonprofit management, board governance, and the linkages between nonprofit organizations and social capital in communities. An ideal candidate will be a proven scholar with experience in advancing academic scholarship with application to the field of practice. The individual's tenure line will reside within the School of Community Resources and Development and also is supported with affiliated faculty status in the ASU Center for Nonprofit Leadership and Management. This position supports research and teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels that extends the understanding of the practice of leaders and managers within nonprofit contexts. This thematic area seeks to advance understanding of the social, cultural, political and economic roles of nonprofit organizations and community development in contemporary society.

Area of Interest: Nonprofit Studies and Philanthropy

We are searching for an individual with expertise in philanthropy (voluntary action for the public good), volunteerism, voluntary action, and charitable giving, who can add strength to our growing nonprofit emphasis area. This position supports research and teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels that extends the understanding of philanthropy and its role within contemporary society. The ways in which philanthropy is a means by which many nonprofit organizations deliver their mission to advance social, cultural, political and economic goals of communities is a thematic interest of this position. The individual's tenure line will reside within the School of Community Resources and Development and also is supported with affiliated faculty status in the ASU Center for Nonprofit Leadership and Management.

Area of Interest: Nonprofit Studies and International NGO's

A faculty member is sought whose publication and external grant record of research are related to nonprofit and nongovernmental organizations within an international context. We are searching for an individual with expertise in nongovernmental organizations and thematic interests in leadership, management and delivery systems pertinent to a global context. The individual should have demonstrated abilities to conduct comparative analysis of NGO models within cross-cultural contexts who can add strength to our growing nonprofit emphasis area. This position supports research and teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels that extends the understanding of the social, cultural, political and economic roles of nongovernmental organizations in civil society within a global context. This includes U.S. based nonprofits with international service reach and nongovernmental organizations indigenous to countries around the world.

Area of Interest: Nonprofit Studies and Community Development

We are searching for an individual with expertise in community development including the processes, efforts and results in building communities through the forging and strengthening social networks and the linkages among nonprofits, business and government. How such linkages improve the economic, social and cultural conditions of communities within community development theories and practice is a focus with this position as is a particular emphasis on nonprofit forms that contribute to civil society. A special focus area on the economics of the nonprofit sector and nonprofit finance and budgeting is an added skill set of value in this position. This position supports research and teaching at the undergraduate and graduate levels that extends the understanding of the social, cultural, political and economic roles of nonprofit organizations within community development strategies in contemporary society.
