out with the rest of the Saints in the spring of 1846. Arriving at the Missouri River he responded to the call of the United States and became a member of the famous Mormon Battalion and suffered the hardships incident to that notable march of infantry. He joined the Saints in Utah in 1848 and moved to Arizona in 1880, living for a timeat Showlow, Mavajo County. His life was spent on the frontiers and he was a hard-working man, always full of faith in the Gospel and died May 5, 1903, 83 years old, at Nutrioso, Apache Co. Arizona.
