Delaware, age 11; appointed from Delaware as 8nd Lieutenant,
United States Army, October 86, 1861, and assigned to the 5th
U. S. Infantry; promoted to 1st Lieutenant, April 30, 1963;
served in Arisona Territory from July, 1864, to September, 1866;
while stationed at Port Whipple, A. T. was invited with other
commissioned officers, by Resolution of the House of Representatives,
1st Legislative Assembly of the Territory of Arisona, "to
coupy seats on the floor of this House", September 30, 1864;
with a detachment of 1st Cavalry, New Mexico Volunteers, he
suprised an Apache Camp near Sycamore Springs, Yavapai County,
A. T., December 31, 1864, when 4 Indians were killed and 2 head
of cattle were captured; promoted Captain, October 31, 1866;
unareigned May 19, 1869; homorably mustered out of the service,
January 1, 1878.

Began the practice of medicine at Litchfield, Meeker County, Minnesota, 1871; removed to Gaveur, Beadle County, South Dakota, where he enjoyed a lucrative practice as a physician; was a member of the local board of pension examiners; went to Washington, D. C. to attend the National Ensampment of the Grand Army of the Republic, where he died at the residence of his

aged 55; buried in Matiemal Cometary, Arlington, Virginia - W. C. 955,291.
