BRUNIER, EUGENE

Arizona in 1863, and was one of the charter members of the Arizona pioneers'
Historical Society. He spent 58 years in Tucson, was engaged in mining and also conducted a store in Tucson. In his early years he had held government positions at El Paso. He lived at one time, in 1894, in Pinos Altos, New Mexico, and was naturalized September 5, 1871, in San Francisco, California.

He died in Tueson on June 7, 1921, and was buried in Holy Hope Cemetery. He left his son James, and a daughter, Josie Brunier.

Elected President of society, December 29, 1913. Died at Tucson, Pima County, Arisona, June 7, 1921, aged 85. Buried, Holy Hope Cemetery, Tucson.
