CARTER, DANIEL J., born at Belfast, Waldo County, Maine, in 1835; son of John Carter; married, Mary L. Carter (1841-1918), daughter of Jonathan and Mary H. Carter, at Montville, Maine, October 1, 1865; they had no children.

Went by sea to California in 1858; enrolled, age 26, at Auburn, Placer County, November 8, and mustered in at Camp Union, near Sacramento, November 18, 1861, to serve 3 years as Fifer, Captain Allen W. Cullum's Company F, 4th California Infantry; occupation when enlisted - Sailor; went with the Company to Southern California in July, 1862; left Drum Barracks, Wilmington, California in April, 1863, for Fort Yuma and remained there until May, 1864; reduced to Private at Fort Yuma, July 31, 1863; stationed at Camp Lincoln (La Paz), A.T., from June to September, 1864; returned to Fort Yuma in September and then marched to Drum Barracks, California, where he was honorably discharged by reason of expiration of his term of service, November 8, 1864.

Returned to Arizona and his name appears on the Great Register of Cochise County as a resident of Tombstone, 1890-98. occupation - Carpenter; Comrade, Burnside Post No. 2, G.A. R., at Tombstone, 1892-99; died at Tombstone. Cochise County, A. T., August 25, 1899, aged 64; buried, _____ Cemetery, at Tombstone; War Department headstone.
