CHACON, RAFAEL, born at Santa Fe, New Mexice, April 22, 1833; son of Albino Chacon and Refugie Secundino Lopez de Chacon; educated in private schools and Ottended the Asademia Militar at Chihuahua, Mexico, 1844-46; married, Juana Maria Paiz at Chamisal, Taos County, N. M., April 15, 1858; children, Gumecinda, Antonio, Husebie and Ledislae; the family resided at Penasco, Taos County, N. M., 1858-70.

Enlisted at Taos, N. M., in Company B. St. Vrains Battalion, New Nexice Volunteers, February 1, 1855, and appointed 1st Sergeant; in @ everal engagements in the UteWar until the Indians surrendered in July; honorably discharged August 13, 1855; appointed Captain, Company K, 1st New Mexice Infantry, at Fort Union, New Mexico, August 13, 1861; participated in the Battle of Valverde, February 21, 1862, and in engagements with Confederates at Albuquerque, Algodones, Peralta, and Les Pines Grove; transferred, by consolidation, as Captain, Company E, 1st New Mexice Cavalry, May 31, 1862.

With 30 men of his Company formed part of the escort of Governor Goodwin and the other Arizona Territorial officials from Albuquerque, New Mexice, to Fort Whipple, A. T., December 8, 1863, to January 22, 1864; returned to New Mexice with his Company and broughts large number of Navajos from Fort Wingate to be interned at Fort Stanton, N. M., (Bosque Redonde); promoted to Najor, March 20, 1864; appointed Commandant at Fort Stanton, June 23, 1864; engaged in numerous © moditions and skirmishes against Apaches and Navajos during period of his service; honorably discharged © t Fort Stanton, New Mexice, September 2, 1864.

Justice of the Peace at Penasco, N. N., for two terms; Member from Taos County, 16th New Mexico Territorial Council, 1866; Chief Clerk, 17th and 18th Territorial Councils, 1867, 1868; moved to Trinidad, Colorado, 1870;
