Reuben P. Campbell, I lieut, Co. E, 2d Dragoons was in Mexico in January, 1848 and later in California until June, 1849. July and August on detached service but station not stated. September, 1849 on leave of six months. He joined his company in July, 1850 and was stationed at Socorro, N. M.; was appointed captain August 8, 1851 while the company was at Socorro. September 13, 1851 removed to Fort Conrad, N. M. October 10, 1851 absent sick.

Reuben P. Campbell, colonel, 7 North Carolina Infantry, C.S.A. entered service May 16, 1861 at Camp Argyle. Another record shows entered State service August 20, 1861, entered Confederate service October 31, 1861. Killed June 27, 1862 at Gaines Mills, Va.
