1858; at the time of his death the Yuma Ar	izona Sentinel stated:

Mr. Costello was one of the oldest settlers of Yuma, having come here from San Diego, as a drummer boy under major Heintzelman. For yearshe was a courier making many hazardous trips through the Indian country. He was connected with the survey of the Gadsden purchase and for many years the trusted messenger of Jack Hinton and W. B. Hooper. During the early days he suffered many hardships, which perhaps, was the cause of his death.
