Commissioned Lieutenant Colonel, 5th California Infantry, September 12, 1861; on detached service at Marysville, California, until April, 1862, when he joined the Headquarters of the Regiment at Camp Wright, near Warner's Ranch, San Diego County, California; was at Fort Yuma awaiting orders when his resignation was accepted, October 31, 1862.

Listed, Territorial Census, April, 1864, 3d District (Yavapai County), age 38, born in Pennsylvania, resident in Arizona 12 months, occupation, Miner, property valued at \$105; U. S. Census, June, 1870, at Ehrenberg, Yuma County, A. T., age 42, born in Pennsylvania, occupation, Lawyer; Appointed Sheriff of Yuma County to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of David King, 1867; Justice of the Peace at La Paz, 1868; District Attorney of Yuma County, 18\_\_ to 18\_\_; Member from La Paz, Yuma County, H. of R., 3d Territorial Legislature 1866; member from Arizona City, Yuma County, 6th Legislature, 1871, (Speaker).  
Died at Yuma, Arizona, August 18, 1871.
