Arrested on order of Colonel J. H. Carleton because of suspected sympathy for the Confederacy and examined by a Board of Officers in Tucson June 7, 1862; left Tucson under guard with other prisoners June 10 and arrived at Fort Yuma, June 22; wrote a letter on June 25 to the Department Commander stating that because of his Union sentiments when Captain Hunter and his Confederate troops were in Tucson in February, 1862, they threatened to chain his hand and foot and send him to the Rio Grande and would have done so had he not eluded their vigilance by making his escape from the town; released from imprisonment at Fort Yuma, August 25, 1862.

Listed, Territorial Census, April, 1864, @ t Tucson, age 33, born in New York, married, family in Tucson, occupation, Miner, property valued at \$300; U. S. Census, July, 1870, at Tucson, age 41, born in New York, occupation, Miner, property valued at \$1500.

Member from Tucson, Pima County, 3d Arizona Legislature @ t Prescott, October 3 to 20, 1866, when he resigned; appointed Under Sheriff of Pima County, 1871; Sergeant at Arms, 7th Territorial Council at Tucson, January 6 to February 14, 1873.

Died at Florence, Arizona on April 4, 1888 aged _____
