Born at Paris, France, October 9, 1832.

Son of Baldwin-Francis and Catherine (Darrell) Duppa of Hollingbourne House near Maidstone, Kent, England. Never married.

Listed, Territorial Census, April, 1864, at Prescott, A. T., occupation, Miner, resident in Arizona 5 months, property valued at \$800; U.S. Census, August 30, 1870, at Salt River Valley, occupation, Farmer: Named Phoenix and Tempe. Died at Phoenix, Maricopa County, A. T., January 29, 1892, aged 59. Buried, Odd Fellows Section, Old City Cemetery, Phoenix, Arizona; remains removed to Greenwood Cemetery, April 25, 1901, where a monument was erected by Maricopa Chapter, D.A.R.
