Whe arrived in Tucson in 1860, when that place was in a pueble existence, with less than a score of Americans, and long before the United States gave it recognition other than by having a few officials in the Custom Service. Farrell's emperience during those early days was a thrilling one, in which he and a few figured in many encounters midimahamametersolutes at the peril of losing their lives. "The country was still warm over the Gadadem purchase of 1853, and we Americans concluded to hold our ground," he said. "The arrival of twoops at the beginning of the Civil War had a scothing effect on the beligerent element, and afterwards we Americans were not alarmed over our safety."

"Farrell was with a party that started from Tassen for the north to prospect in what is now Tawapai county, before the capital was established in Prescott in 1864. We followed placer mining along lynx Creek and other streams nearby, and later become interested in quarts mines, looming in the then became fields of the Peck and Tiptop. In later years he engaged in business in Prescott and later in Phoenix. Tom Farrell was never known to run from an enemy, or to descrit a friend.
