FITCH, JESSE IVES, born at Delhi, Delaware County, New York,
December 4, 1826^{Nov 30 4}; son of Dr. Cornelius Post Fitch and Paulina Harrington; *dau. of

Enrolled at Forest Hill, September 12 and mustered in on
September 25, 1861, at Auburn, Placer County, California, as
Captain, Company B, 4th California Infantry; went with the Company
in November to Fort Vancouver, Washington Territory, to relieve
Regular troops ordered east and stationed there until March, 1862;
at Fort Dalles, Oregon, from April to October, when he went with
the Company to Benicia Barracks, California; went by sea to Drum
Barracks, near San Pedro, California, in March, 1863, and remained
there for a month; marched to Fort Mohave, A.T., and stationed there
from May to December, 1863; returned to Drum Barracks and stationed
there from January to December, 1864; honorably discharged at
San Francisco, California, January 31, 1865.

Practiced law at Auburn, Placer County, California, where
he died on September 17, 1884, aged 57.
