ceding, was born at Griesheim, May 16,1805. He was professor of history and natural history at Zurich from 1833 to 1844, and published a "System of Crystalology," (1843). He became a leader of the democratic party in Germany in 1848, and a member of the Parliament of Frankfort. He was united with Blum in a deputation to Vienna, and was arrested there, but acquitted. In 1873 he entered the German consular service. Among his works are "Experiences, Travels, Studies, etc., in America," (2 vols., 1858,) "Theety of Politics," (1861-64,) and "The Realistic View of the World, and Utilitarian Civilization," (1881.) Died 1894.
