Juan Francis, Alphonsus Francis and Vincente (Wife. \_\_\_\_\_)

Had been assistant lighthouse keeper at Point Concepcion <sup>California</sup>  
when mustered in at San Francisco as 1st Lieutenant, Company B, 1st  
California Cavalry, September 5, 1861; marched from Fort Yuma to the  
Pima Villages, April, 1862; in command of a platoon which was among  
the first of the Federal troops to occupy Tucson on May 20; went from  
there to Fort Buchanan but returned to Tucson where he was sick for  
a few weeks; stationed at San Pedro Crossing from July 19 to December 22,  
1862; served in New Mexico until September 30, 1864, when he was  
mustered out at Fort Union; appointed 1st Lieutenant, 11th Missouri  
Cavalry at Little Rock, Arkansas, March 17, 1865, and served as aide-  
de-camp to Brigadier General Joseph R. West until honorably discharged  
at New Orleans, Louisiana, July 27, 1865.

Died at Los Angeles, California, July 15, 1886, aged 44.
