Cadet at West Point, 1837-41; Brevet 2d Lieutenant 5th U. S. Infantry, July 1, 1841, on frontier duty in Michigan 1841-45 in military occupation of Texas, 1845; promoted 2d Lieutenant, 7th U. S. Infantry, April 18, 1845; assistant instructor of infantry tactics at West Point, 1845-52; promoted 1st Lieutenant, same regiment, August 20, 1847; escorting Topographical Expedition Commanded by Lieutenant A. W. Whipple 1853-54; promoted Captain, 7th U.S. Infantry, March 3, 1855; participated in Utah Expedition, 1858-60; marched to New Mexico and stationed at Fort Defiance 1860, and at Fort McLane, 1861; resigned May 27, 1861; Brigadier General, Confederate States Army; killed at the Battle of Spottsylvania Court House, Virginia, May 10, 1864, aged 45.
