KELSO, JOHN WESLEY

Born at \_\_\_\_\_, Franklin County, Ohio, February 15, 1841.

Son of \_\_\_\_\_ and \_\_\_\_\_ (he never married).

Enrolled October 4, 1862, at Georgia Gulch, Colorado Territory, and mustered in at Denver City, January 13, 1863, to serve three years as Private, Company A, 3rd Colorado Infantry; occupation when enlisted, Miner; transferred, November 26, 1865, to Company H, 2nd Colorado Cavalry; stationed in Colorado, New Mexico and Kansas; honorably discharged at Fort Riley, Kansas, July 9, 1865. Resided in Tombstone, A. T., from 1879 to 1902, and in Douglas, and at Cananea, Sonora, Mexico from 1902 to 1917. Member, Arizona Pioneers' Historical Society, Tucson; Comrade, Burnside Post No. 36, GAR, Tombstone, 1886. Admitted from Douglas, Cochise County, Arizona, to the U. S. Soldiers' Home, Sawtelle, Los Angeles, County, California, January 26, 1917, where he died on May 10, 1917, aged 76; buried Soldiers' Home Cemetery.-
