Mesers. Davis & McKinnon, who came down from that snowy region—head of Lynx Creek—Passday last, say Indians visited the vacant cabins on the creek recently, but did not molest anything. Graves and others, for G.C. Bean, of this town, had commenced operations on the Tie-Tie lode.

Was a member of the prospecting party led by Calvin Jackson which employed the country east of the Yerds River in September, 1869, and was employed at the pel Pasco mill, near Grown King in October, 1872; another reference to him in the Arisona Hiner was on August 13, 1875;

Red McKinnen, of the War Engle mine near Bradehaw, was in town last week. Mr. George Jackson, of Walnut Grove, also called upon us. Mr. McKinnen gives a good account of their mine, which has paid steadily for arrastraing for several years with no perceptible change in the character of the ore or amount of pay. He thinks the Peck is a continuation of the War Engle lede, and though one is gold and the other silver, his theory is that the War Engle being near the top and the Peck at the base of the mountain, the gold in his mine will run out at a few hundred feet depth and silver take its place, and when a level is reached as deep as the surface of the Peck the mines will be identical.

His obituary in the Baily Arisona Miner of January 17, 1880, reads:

Mr. NcKinnon came to Proscott in 1865 and followed mining in different places in this county until the year 1872, when he formed a co-partmership with Judge John Goodwin, now of the Yerde, in opening the Var Regle mine in the Bradshew mountains. In 1875 they sold the property for \$15,000 and desolved partmership when the deceased went to his home in Canada on a visit. He returned at the close of 1876, since which time he has been gradually sinking to his grave with consumption. Under the care of the Sisters of St. Joseph he received every wish and attention possible, but the Heavenly Messenger came last night and hore his soul away to that home beyond our view.

Died at Prescott, A.T., January 16, 1860, aged about 50; buried, Catholic Cometery, Prescott.
