Appointed 2d Lieutenant, U. S. Mounted Rifles, May 27, 1846; brevet 1st Lieutenant for gallant and meritorious conduct at the Battles of Contreras and Churubusco, Mexico, August 20, and brevet Captain for like conduct at the Battle of Chapultepec, September 13, 1847 promoted, 1st Lieutenant October 9, 1847 and to Captain, December 30, 1856; participated in the Navajo Campaign and was severely wounded near Bear Springs (now Fort Wingate,) N.M., August 29, 1858; killed in action with Navajo Indians at the southern base of Black Rock near Fort Defiance, New Mexico, October 13, 1860; aged _____; Buried _____ Cemetery _____.

Fort McLane, New Mexico, named for him.
