MORE, JOHN L.

MORE, JOHN LOWRE, born in Glasgow, Scotland, January 3, 1831; never married; enrolled, age 33, at Bear Valley, Mariposa County, October 30 and mustered in December 10, 1864, to serve 3 years as Private Company H, 7th California Infantry; occupation when enlisted - Laborer; went with the Company to Southern California and was stationed at Fort Yuma from June, 1865 to February, 1866, except when he was on detached service as escort to Tubac, A.T., in October, 1865; honorably discharged at Drum Barracks, Los Angeles County, California, March 1, 1866.

Returned to Cochise County, A.T., in the eighties and worked as a miner; Comrade Kehoe Post No. 102, Grand Army of the Republic at Bisbee, 1886; admitted from Bisbee to the U. S. Soldiers Home, Sawtelle, California, October 18, 1894, where he died 21 years later on January 8, 1916, aged 85; buried Soldiers Home Cemetery.
