Enrolled at Shasta, Shasta County, California, October 2, and mustered in at Auburn, Placer County, California, October 5, 1861, to serve three years as Corporal, Captain Benjamin R. West's Company C, 4th California Infantry; occupation when enlisted, Einer; marched with the company to Fort Walla Walla, Washington, Territory, in November to relieve Regular troops ordered east and stationed there until September, 1862; returned to California and was at Benicia Barracks until May, 1863; promoted Sergeant November 1, 1862; went by sea to San Pedro and stationed at Drum Barracks until January, 1864; did a tour of duty at Catalina Island from February to September and then returned to Drum Barracks where he was honorably discharged on expiration of his term of service, October 5, 1864.

at the Presidio of San Francisco, California, as 2d Lieutenant to serve in Captain John W. Owen's Company F, 7th California Infantry; remained at the Presidio until June, 1865, then went by sea to San Pedro, California, and marched from there to Fort Yuma; left Fort Yuma in August and merched on the Overland Stage route to Maricopa Wells, A.T., left there in October for Fort McDowell and was stationed there until Merch 4, 1866; returned with the company

by the same route to the Presidio of San Francisco, where he was honorably discharged April 22, 1866.
