at a pioneer reunion held in Phoenix on April 13, 1921, he is quoted in the

Arizona Republican as saying:

The Barnhart family was at Beaver Springs in the Sacramento Valley when the Indians tried to steal cattle from their herd in the night. A party of white men went in pursuit of the Walapais and finally caught up with them. They were not ten feet from us "that one with the knife is mine" shouted one of the leaders of the party. "I want to scalp him with his own knife" and I will say here that he did.

We then preceded to Hardyville where Captain Hardy greeted us. "What luck" he shouted as we approached. "Pretty good but not as good as we wanted" we replied. Captain Hardy then proceeded to serve the drinks and he sure had plenty of them.

Died at the Arizona Pioneers Home in Prescott, October 13, 1927, aged 81; buried Pioneers Cemetery, Prescott.
