STEPHENS, VARNEY ANDREN 01

STEPHENS, VARNEY ANDREW, bern near Thempkinsville, Monree County, Kentucky, May 16, 1820; son of John E. and Polly (Geralds) Stephens; married Hancy & Ball in Missouri, March 1, 1846; children, John C., Caroline E. (Mrs. Benjamin H. Weaver), Martina (Mrs. William M. Kelly) and Jesephine (Mrs. Warren C. Potts).

West to Missouri in 1840 where he first located on a farm about 12 miles from St. Jeseph in Buchanan County, but later moved to near Athens in Clarke County; went to Denton County, Texas la 1856 where he Ingaged in farming and I technology and did some freighting; left there early in February, 1864, with an ex-train and some cattle and after an eight @ on hs journey arrived with his family in Prescott, A.T. on October 5; the Apaches stole a large part of his live stock and te make a living he engaged in getting out saw-timber; listed, Sheriff 's census of Yuma County, 1866, at Williams Fork with wife, son and three daughters; returned to Prescott where the names of the family appear in the U.S. Consus, in July, 1870; was in the Salt River Valley late in September where he was one of the organizers of the Prescett Ditch Company; joined with some of the same men in organizing, on December 2, 1870, the Virginia Farming Ditch Company with a heading about 2 0 iles upstream; both of these proposed Canals were intended to irrigate lands on the south side of Salt River opposite Phoenix,

from 1866 to 1872 his principal occupation was freighting after which he entered into partnership with his son-in-law, under the same of Kelly and Stephens, and for nearly 30 years they conducted a succesful general merchandise business at the corner of Montesuma and Gurley Streets, in Prescott, Their advertisement in the <u>Arisona Miner</u> of

Stephens, Varaey A.

April 26, 1878 reads as follows:

KELLY & STEPHENS,

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NEWS AGENTS and dealers in

BOOKS, STATIONERY, FANCY GOODS,

Yankee Notiens, Confectionery,

Tobacco and Cigars, Neerschaum & Briarwood Pipes, Toys, dolls, fine paperterie

Boots, Shoes & Hosiery, Gent's underwear, riveted overalls and pants, school books, buck and woolen gloves, musical instruments, fiddle and guitar strings, etc., etc.

84; buried in the Masonic Cometery, Prescott.
