STARKWEATHER, FUGENE

STARKWEATHER EUGENE, born in Genesee County, New York, 1841; probably son of Hiram and Matilda Starkweather of Bethany in that County; enrolled August 20, 1861, at Folsom, Sacramento County, California, and mustered in at Camp Merchant (Oakland), California, to serve 3 years as Private in Captain Edward D. Shirland's Company C, 1st California Cavalry; occupation when enlisted, Farmer; left San Francisco with the Company, September 25, and went by sea to San Pedro and on to Camp Latham, arriving September 27, 1861; left there early in April and marched to Fort Yuma; drowned while bathing in the Gila River at Gila City, April 29, 1862, aged 21.
