TOBIN, WILLIAM C _____

Enrolled, age 23, September 5 at San Francisco and mustered in September 9, 1861, at Camp Merchant, Oakland, California. to serve 3 years as Private, Captain Emil Fritz's Company B, 1st California Cavalry; occupation when enlisted, Farmer; went with the Company in October to Camp Carleton, near San Bernardino, in Southern California; left Camp Carleton in the advance guard of the "California Column", March 1, 1862, and marched via Fort Yuma and the Pima Villages to Picacho Pass where he was wounded in the head in action with Confederates, April 15, 1862; sick in hospital at Fort Barrett, on the Pima Indian Reservation, from May 12 to August; moved to Fort Yuma in September and remained there sick until December; honorably discharged on Surgeon's Certificate of Disability at Camp Drum, Willmington, Los Angeles County, California, January 6, 1863.
