### *Primary Election*

Last Day to Register to Vote	August 4, 2008
Early Voting Begins	July 31, 2008
Last Day to Request Early Voting Ballot	August 22, 2008
Election Day	September 2, 2008

### *General Election*

Last Day to Register to Vote	October 6, 2008
Early Voting Begins	October 2, 2008
Last Day to Request Early Voting Ballot	October 24, 2008
Election Day	November 4, 2008

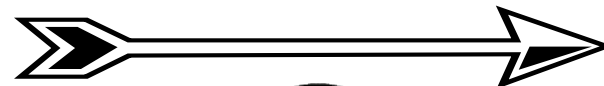

## PROPOSITION 200

On November 2, 2004, the Arizona voters passed into law Proposition 200, which changed the requirements for registering to vote and voting at the polls. Early voting procedures did not change. In addition, a permanent early voting list was created that may assist some voters to cast a ballot. Here are the new provisions for voting.

### REGISTRATION

#### ***Must Show Proof of Citizenship***

The following is a list of acceptable documents to establish your citizenship:

- Arizona driver's license **NUMBER** or non-operating ID license **NUMBER** issued after Oct. 1, 1996 (Box 13);
- Bureau of Indian Affairs card **NUMBER**, Tribal Treaty Card **NUMBER** or Tribal Enrollment **NUMBER** (Box 16);
- US naturalization certificate **NUMBER** (Box 20);
- A legible **PHOTOCOPY** of a driver's license or non-operating ID license from another state that identifies US citizenship;
- Legible **PHOTOCOPY** of a birth certificate with the name of the applicant that verifies US citizenship;
- A legible **PHOTOCOPY** of a US passport identifying the applicant; or
- A legible **PHOTOCOPY** of a Tribal Certificate of Indian Blood or Tribal or Bureau of Indian Affairs Indian Affairs Affidavit of Birth

## VOTING AT THE POLLS ***Must Show Proof of Identity***

A voter must present one (1) ID that bears the name, current address, and photograph under LIST #1:

### LIST # 1

- Valid Arizona driver's license or non-operating ID license
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal ID (must include photo, name, and current address)
- Valid US federal, state or local government issued ID

### OR

A voter must present two (2) IDs that bear the name, and current address under LIST #2.

### LIST #2

- Utility bill of the elector that is dated within 90 days of the date of the election. A utility bill may be for electric, gas, water, solid waste, sewer, telephone, cell phone or cable television.
- Bank or credit union statement that is dated within 90 days of the date of the election
- Valid Arizona vehicle registration
- Indian census card
- Property tax statement of the elector's residence
- Tribal enrollment card or other form of tribal ID
- Vehicle registration card
- Valid US federal, state, or local government issued ID
- Voter registration card/recorders' certifications
- Any "Official Election Material" mailing bearing your name and address

## NEW ID PROVISIONS FOR INDIANS

Acceptable forms of tribal identification include (but are not limited to): a tribal identification or enrollment card issued under the authority of a federally recognized Indian tribe, nation, community, or band ("tribe"), a tribal subdivision or the Bureau of Indian Affairs; or a Certificate of Indian Blood issued to a tribal member under the authority of a tribe or by the Bureau of Indian Affairs; or a voter registration card for tribal elections issued under the authority of a tribe; or a home site assignment lease, permit or allotment issued under the authority of a tribe, tribal subdivision, or by the Bureau of Indian Affairs; or a grazing permit or allotment issued to a tribal member under the authority of a tribe, tribal subdivision, or by the Bureau of Indian Affairs.

## EARLY VOTING ***Nothing Has Changed***

There is no ID requirement if you vote an early ballot. Voting an early ballot may be a good idea if:

- You do not need language assistance.
- You are comfortable getting a ballot in the mail.
- Your mail is delivered to your home, or
- Your post office box is easily accessible

Your ballot must be received by the County Recorder by 7 PM on Election Day, or you may drop off your early voting ballot at any polling place, in your county, on Election Day.

## PERMANENT EARLY VOTING LIST

Being on the Permanent Early Voting List will ensure that you receive an early voting ballot for **every** election.

To request an early voting ballot or to request to be on the Permanent Early Voting List, contact your County Recorder's office.
