SUMMER YOUTH ENTREPRENEURSHIP ACADEMY

The American Indian Policy Institute and ASU Technopolis will conduct a 3 1/2 day summer workshop for Junior and Senior High School Students from the Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community. The workshop will provide training and mentoring to students who would like to start a sustainable business. The workshop will begin on Tuesday, June 3 through Saturday, June 6, 2009. Students will be staying at the Palo Verde West dormitory on campus and will attend daily classes. The last day of the event will take place at ASU SkySong campus in Scottsdale.

Employment Opportunity

The American Indian Policy Institute is seeking three ASU students to be hired as summer counselors to assist with 25 visiting students throughout the Academy. Counselors will help to make sure the visiting students get to classes, follow Academy behavior guidelines and feel comfortable at ASU. Counselors are not responsible for teaching classes.

ASU students who are hired as counselors will need to attend a preparatory meeting before the Academy begins.

Students Counselors will be paid a stipend of \$600 for work on this project.

Note: These are student hourly positions and there will be no tuition remission or benefits provided.

Qualifications

- Must be a full-time ASU Student during the Fall Semester and can be either an Undergraduate or Graduate student.
- Must be willing to spend entire 3 1/2 days with visiting students which includes overnight in dorms as well as all day activities.

Desired

- Prefer students knowledgeable about Salt River Pima-Maricopa Indian Community and/or American Indian Communities.
- Prefer students in good academic standing.
- Prefer students who are responsible and mature.
- Prefer students who are outgoing and friendly.
- Prefer students who communicate effectively.
