- <sup>3</sup> Alternatively, student may take any Pima MAT course numbered 151 or higher that transfers as ASU College Mathematics or higher based on the CEG at the time of course completion.
- <sup>4</sup> Select any Pima SSE course that transfers to ASU as Elective Credit or better. Consult the Course Equivalency Guide for current transfer information.
- <sup>5</sup> Select transferable elective courses that also meet any remaining General Education Special Requirements (I,C,G) or Language Requirement to avoid the accrual of excess credit hours.
- <sup>6</sup> This requirement may also be satisfied by certified proficiency in any language, other than English, at the fourth semester level. The School of Social Work strongly encourages students to consider Spanish or a Tribal language. Students may choose to take required language courses at ASU.
