- (d) Completion of application to the Block program, and
- (e) Three EPE core classes plus 4 credits of EPE 110 must be completed.

To file your Declaration of Graduation, go to the College of Education, Payne Hall L1-13. You must be admitted to the Physical Education Teacher Preparation Program (PETPP or "Block") before you can file a Declaration of Graduation.
