## What is SafeZONE?

---

SafeZONE was created to provide a safer, more receptive, and accepting campus climate by preparing members of the ASU community to serve as a resource on LGBTQ issues while educating the campus community about the SafeZONE Program.

---

The SafeZONE Program also provides opportunities for members of the LGBTQ community to learn more about themselves and to develop partnerships with allies.

## What are the three workshops?

---

### SafeZONE 101

- Enables you to learn about the LGBTQ community
- Increases your understanding of sexual orientation

### Gender Identity 101

- Enables you to learn about the Transgender community
- Expands your understanding of the complex connection between gender, sex & sexuality
- Increases your awareness of the fluid nature of gender and gender expression

### Becoming an Ally

- Assists you in understanding the role of an Ally
- Helps you to develop your skills as an Ally

## How can I get involved?

---

### Become an official ASU SafeZONE Ally

Upon completion of all three workshops you may choose to become an official ASU SafeZONE Ally and receive a SafeZONE placard. This placard identifies you as a resource and your area as a safe space for those who may want to discuss LGBTQ issues. Allies agree to continually educate themselves and others about sexual orientation & gender identity, and to combat homophobia, transphobia, and heterosexism on a personal level.
