

# REQUESTING FUNDS FROM ASASU



## Sun Devil Suggestions

There are many ways to request funds from ASASU. There are three branches of government within ASASU and each one has funding to allocate to individual students and student organizations.

### Undergraduate Student Government

- Undergraduate campus clubs and organizations may be funded.
- Examples are: Ultimate Frisbee Club, Argentine Tango Club, Indian Student Association, etc...

### Programming and Activities Board

- The Diversity Awareness Programming Board, DAPB, may fund Undergraduate or Graduate student clubs and organizations.
- Examples are organizations affiliated with the ASU Coalitions.
- Organizations can also apply for ASASU On-Campus Co-Sponsorship.

### Graduate and Professional Student Association

- Graduate Student Organizations, GSO's may be funded.
- Travel grants are awarded to graduate students to attend conferences or workshops.
- Research grants are also awarded to qualifying ASU graduate students.

Each branch of government has a different procedure for allocating funds. Visit the ASASU offices on the 3<sup>rd</sup> floor of the MU to pick up applications and to ask questions.
