## A Comprehensive Approach


Combining the expertise of key campus units, the Student Assistance Coordination Committee (SACC) meets regularly to coordinate responses to students in distress and to manage potential critical incidents involving ASU students.

SACC is comprised of representatives from campus departments who are primary responders trained to intervene with students in distress and during critical incidents. These departments include: Student Advisory, Dean/Student Affairs, ASU Counseling Services, University Housing, ASU Police, Disability Resources, the Office of the General Counsel and ASU Health Services.

SACC meets regularly to review and discuss trends in student behavior & campus safety related issues.

More importantly, SACC is convened to evaluate situations in which a student is experiencing distress or is a potential danger to him/herself and/or others.

SACC is charged with evaluating such behavior and making recommendations to minimize its impact.



### SACC should be notified.

- Whenever ASU faculty, staff, or students identify a concern about the well-being or behavior of an ASU student.
- Whenever an ASU student makes an explicit threat of violence to any member of the ASU community or public.
- Whenever an ASU student exhibits behavior that can reasonably be interpreted as threatening to self or others.
- Whenever an ASU student is arrested for a violent offense outside of ASU.
- Whenever an ASU department or unit would like specific training on identifying signs of troubling student behavior.

All incidents and allegations of violent or threatening conduct by an ASU student (whether on-campus or off-campus) must be reported to ASU Police Department at (480) 965–3456 and to the Office of the Dean of Student Affairs immediately.
