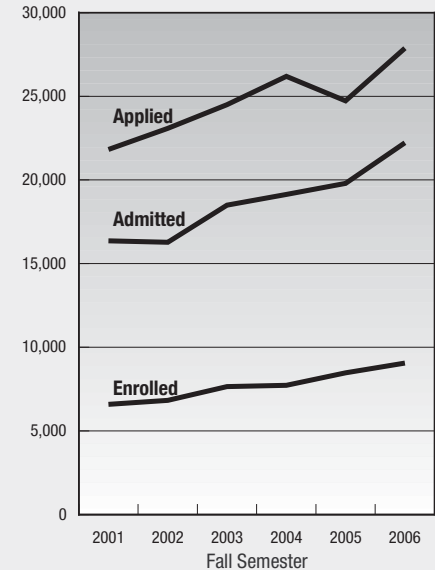

### Freshmen Five-Year Trend



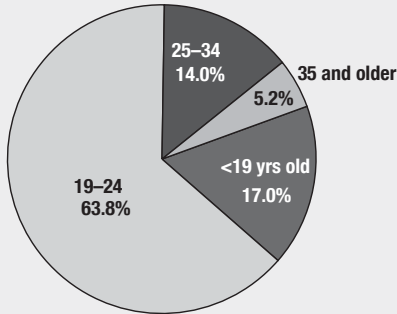

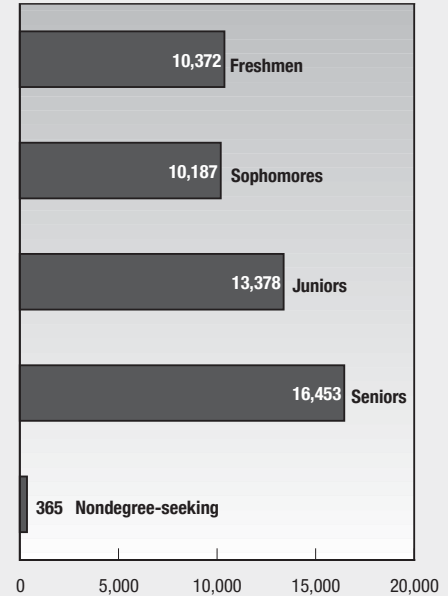

### Enrollment by Level



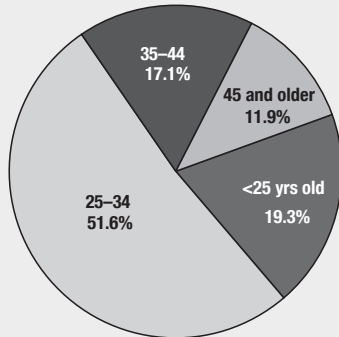

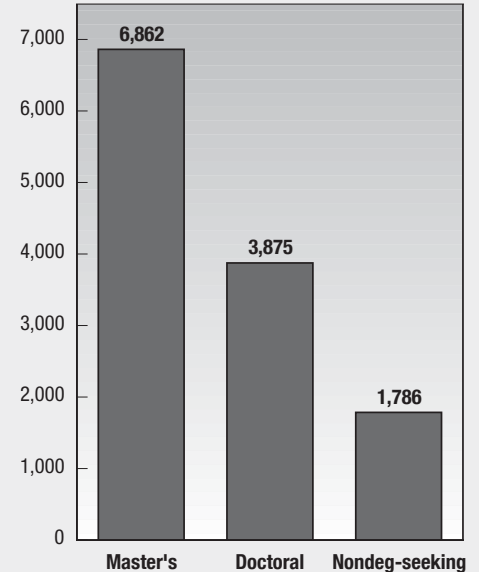

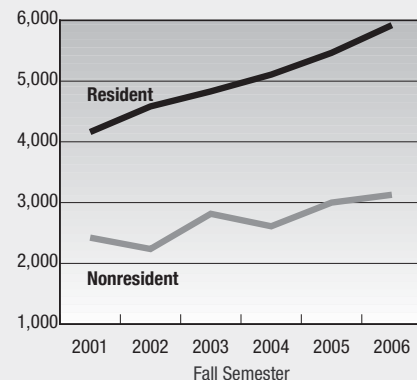

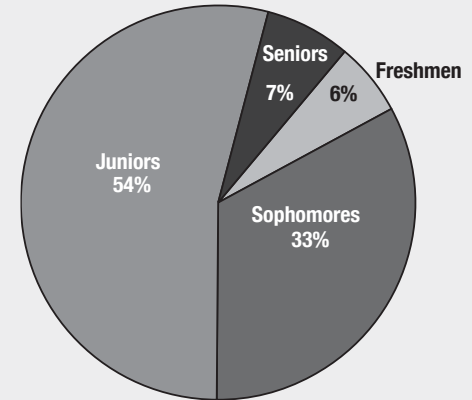

### Fall 2006 Distribution by Level

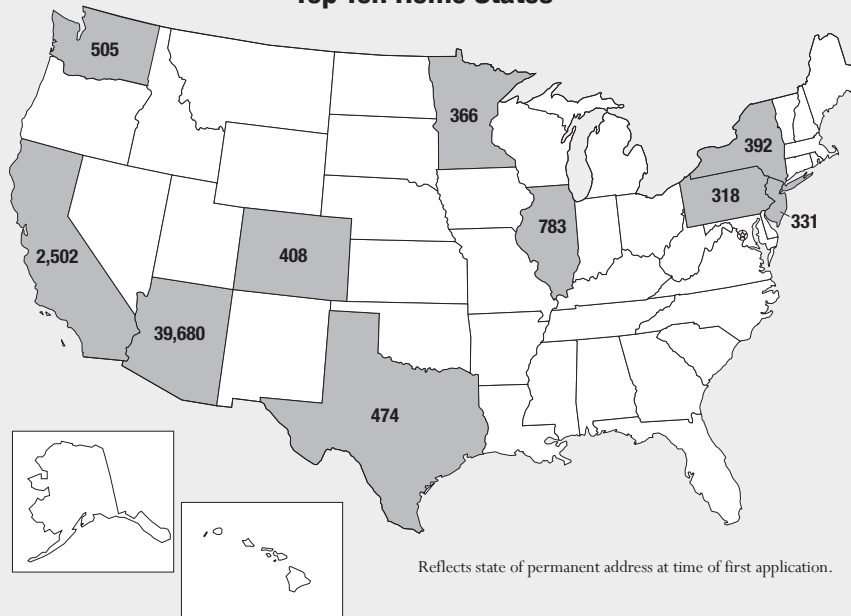


Lower-division transfers are new transfers entering as freshmen or sophomores. Upper-division transfers are new transfers entering as juniors or seniors.

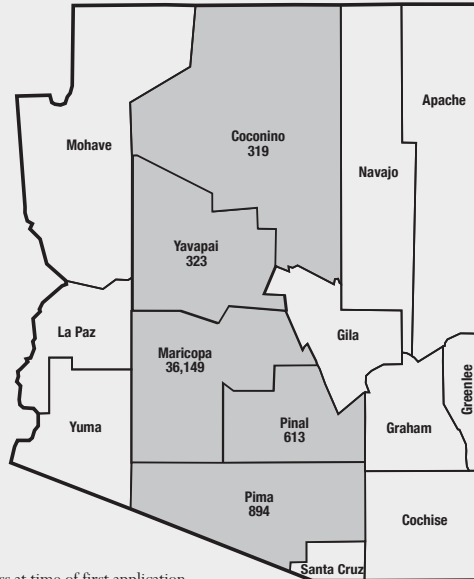

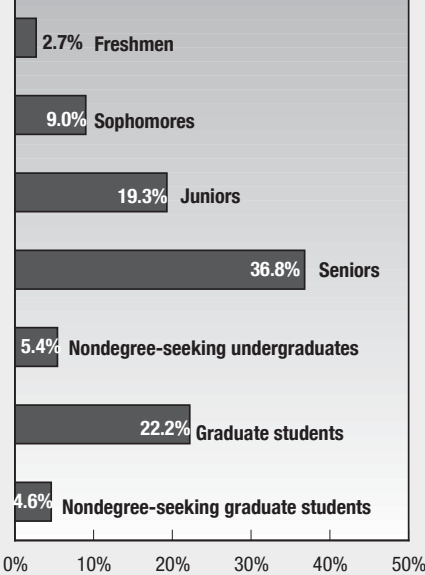

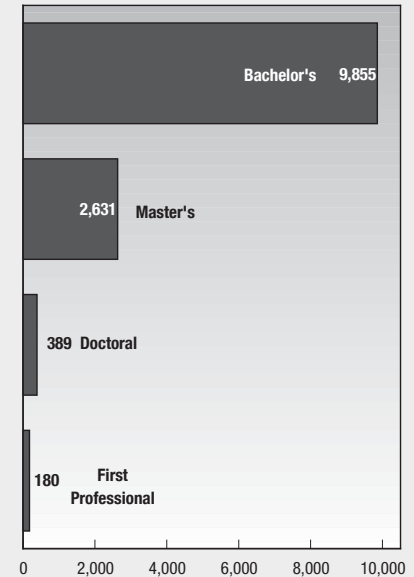

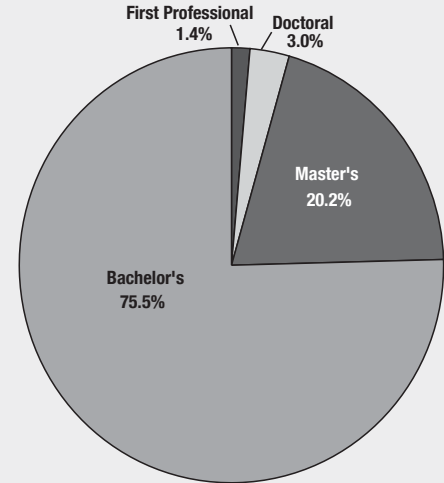

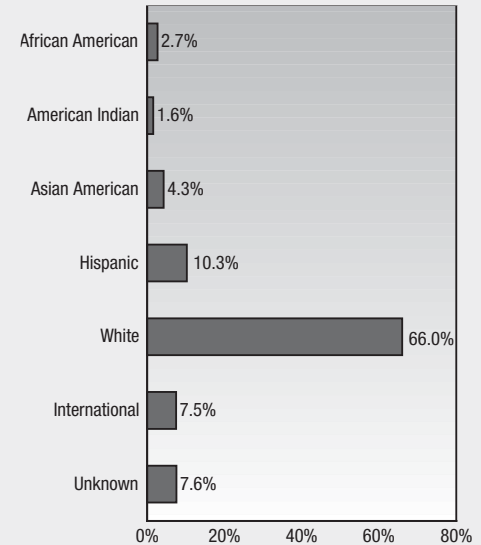
