It's time to wash your hands

In a 2016 study*, researchers found that more than 90 percent of lab personnel did not wash their hands after removing gloves. Wash your hands to prevent contamination and promote a healthy workplace. Every time you remove your gloves, follow these five steps.

- Wet hands with warm or cold water.
 Turn the water off. Sun Devils are clean and sustainable.
- Scrub hands for at least 20 seconds. Hum the Happy Birthday song from beginning to end twice.

- Lather both sides of hands with soap; wash between fingers and under nails.
- Rinse hands with water.
