

## Certificate of Confined Space Hazard Elimination

Post this form at entrance to space. Do not use for spaces with hazardous atmospheres.

According to OSHA 1910.146, you must follow these requirements and the space mustmeet these conditions when classifying a confined space as a non-permit confined space:

- Certify this documentation with the following:
  - o Date.
  - Location of the space. Prove the space's number or by being as specific about physicallocation as possible.
  - Make the certification available to each entrant, or their authorized representative. At ASU, this is accomplished by posting the form at the site of entry.
  - Signature of the person making the determination. At ASU, this certification is determined by an employee who is trained and competent in the subject of confinedspace entry and safety.
- Document how you determined the confined space contained no permit-required confined space hazards.
- If you must enter to remove hazards, the space must be treated as a permitrequired confined space until hazards have been eliminated.
- The confined space doesn't contain an actual or potentially hazardous atmosphere.
- The confined space doesn't contain hazards capable of causing death or serious physical harm. This includes any recognized health or safety hazards including engulfment in solid orliquid material, electrical shock or moving parts.

**Note:** This certification must be completed every time a permit-required confined space is reclassified as a non-permit space.
