

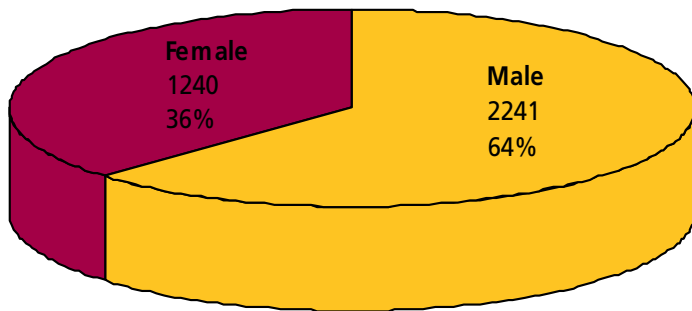

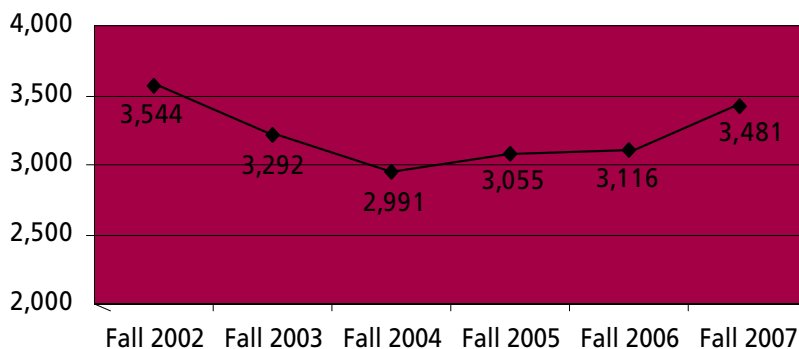
## About the International Enrollment Report

The International Student Office (ISO) at Arizona State University (ASU) at the Tempe campus is under the administrative department of Educational Development. ISO supports student success by engaging non-immigrant students to responsibly maintain compliance to their visa status and by providing programming and advisement that enrich their educational experience.

The ISO publishes this report to inform collaborative partners about current enrollment, trends and changes that occurred in total international student enrollment on the four campuses of ASU. For purposes of this report, the terms non-immigrant and international are used interchangeably.

*Note: This report does not include intensive English or International students on Optional Practical Training.*

## International Enrollment Trends

The non-immigrant student population exhibited an increase for the second consecutive year reaching 3,481 in fall 2007, an increase of 12 percent from 2006. Total enrollment at ASU increased by 2 percent during the same period.

One thousand one hundred sixty one new international students enrolled at ASU, a 13 percent increase of new students over the previous fall. Students beginning new programs in fall 2007 represented 33 percent of the total international student population. New graduate enrollment increased by 22 percent. Of the 353 new undergraduates enrolling at ASU, the majority were freshmen.

The vast majority of non-immigrants (90%) hold an F-1 or J-1 student visa and enrollment of male students exceeded that of females by 28 percent.

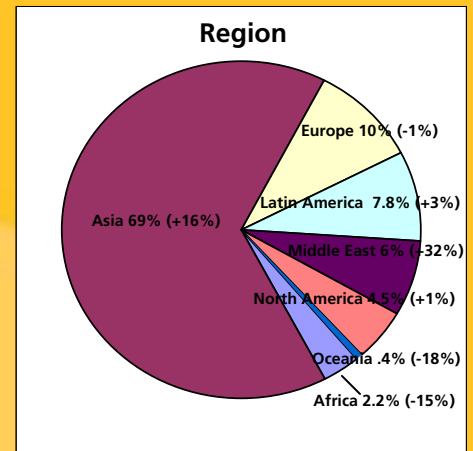

### Countries of Origin

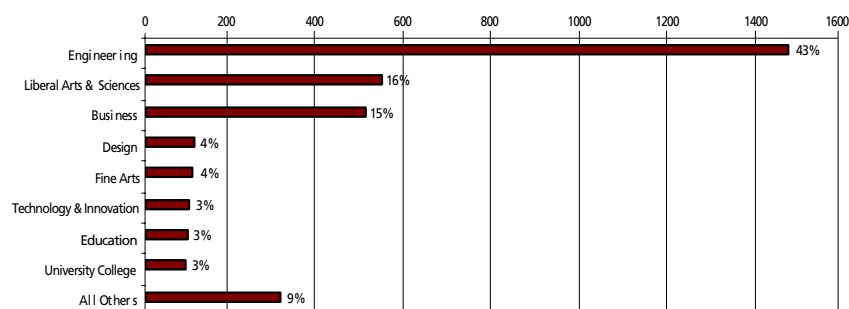
Non-immigrant students from Asia recorded the largest number of students (69%), with enrollment from the top two countries, India and China, increasing by 31 and 17 percent respectively. Vietnam replaced Pakistan on the list of top 15 countries in 2007 with an increase of 10 percent over last year. Total enrollment increased in every region with the exception of students from Africa, Europe and Oceania.

## Colleges and Schools

The Ira A. Fulton School of Engineering was selected by the largest number of non-immigrant students (1,480) followed by the College of Liberal Arts and Sciences (566) and the W.P. Carey School of Business (524). The top three enrolling colleges and schools represented 74 percent of the total international student enrollment at ASU and 91 percent are completing academic programs at the Tempe campus.

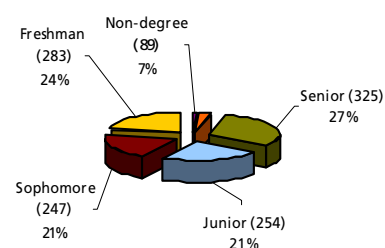

## Class Status

The majority of ASU non-immigrant students (66%) pursued graduate degrees.

Undergraduate students comprised 34 percent of total international student population and freshman international students represented 24 percent of the undergraduate class for fall 2007.
