TRACK MEET.



They were also well represented in the way of track men, as will be shown further on. A feature of the meet was the splendid work of their weight man, H. Smith, who took everything in the way of weights, making altogether 118 points for Phoenix High.

Pole Vault—In this we had hard luck, as Dykes, our strongest man, was not in his usual form. Johnny Mullen made a fine showing, but dropped out at 8 feet. 3 inches, giving first and second to Hawley and Irvine.

100 Yard Dash—This was the High school's strongest point, and they won first and second. Corpstein winning in the fast time of 10 1-5 seconds, Higley second and Sheldon third.

220 Yard Dash—There is no doubt we would have made first in this had Higley not fouled and blocked Sheldon. Higley was disqualified. Corpstein
