Came to Las Cruces, New Mexico with his parents, 1850; made a number of freighting and trading trips to Independence, Missouri; first came to Arizona about 1864; after his marriage he moved to the Salt River Valley and was employed in digging a canal by Charles T. Hayden at Tempe; later went to Prescott and then returned to Tucson where he drove a stage between there and Sasabi; engaged in freighting between Willcox and Globe; about 1900 he settled on a ranch near Picacho where he made his home until the time of his death at Tucson, Pima County, A. T., March 29, 1907, age 63; buried, Catholic Cemetery, Tucson.
