BOOTES, LEVI CLARK

Born in the District of Columbia, December 8, 1809.

Son of Samuel and Elizabeth (Clark) Bootes

Married, Mary Louisa Bird at Wilmington, Delaware, May 9, 1837.

Children, Samuel Bird, James T., Harry Van Dyke, Robert J. and Alice I. (Mrs. _____).

Came to Fort Mohave, Arizona Territory, June, 1859; participated in combat with the Mohave Indians, August 4, 1859; listed, U.S. Census, 1860, at Fort Yuma, Age 42, occupation, Soldier, property valued at \$3,600.

Died at Wilmington, New Castle County, Delaware, April 18, 1896, aged 86.

Buried Brandywine Cemetery Wilmington, Delaware
