Married Alice E. ^{Hatch?}Heath, age 20, at Sacramento, California, January 25, 1865, by Reverend Briggs of the 6th Street Methodist Church; they were divorced on May 31, 1879; children, William M. and _____.

Enrolled at Sacramento August 29 and mustered in at San Francisco, September 13, 1861, to serve 3 years as Quartermaster Sergeant, Company F, (known as the Sacramento Rangers) 2d California Cavalry; promoted to Regimental Commissary Sergeant at Camp Alert, San Francisco, January 10, 1862; honorably discharged April 15, 1862, to accept promotion to 2d Lieutenant, Company H, 2d California Infantry; four days later he left Alcatraz with the Company and was stationed in Humboldt County, until February, 1863, when he was assigned to recruit a new company of cavalry.

Promoted to Captain, Company H, 1st California Cavalry December 31, 1863, being in command when the Company was organized at Camp Union, near Sacramento; left there in March, 1864 and went with the Company to Southern California and then on to Tucson in May; resigned his commission at Tucson June 10 and was honorably discharged the service to date from June 30, 1864.

Returned to Sacramento where he was married in 1865; listed, Sacramento City Directories, 1870 to 1874 as Salesman for Gillig, Mott & Co.; went back to Arizona ^{about 1877}~~in the late 70's~~; the Tucson Arizona Star of February

12, 1880, states that:

Captain W. L. Campbell of Calabasas is establishing a general merchandise business in connection with his mining interests. He will soon complete a two story building.
