Married, Isabela Pacheco at Tucson, A. T., December 3, 1872,

by Charles H. Meyer, Justice of the Peace.

Listed, Territorial Census, 1864, at Tucson, age 32, occupation, Farmer, property valued at \$1,400, resident in Arizona 2 years; he and Newton Israel had a general merchandise store at Camp Grant from October, 1868 until December, 1869, when they dissolved partnership and Israel took over the business; the following advertisement appeared in the Tucson Arizonian:

## CAMP GRANT STORE!

---o---

The undersigned would respectfully announce that they have just opened a new stock of goods consisting of DRY GOODS, GROCERIES, HARDWARE, &c.

and are prepared to sell on the "live and let live" principle:

Would also announce to those persons desirous to settle upon the Lower San Pedro, that they are proprietors of a large Asequia and will allow water to be taken from it by actual settlers free of charge.

Listed, U. S. Census, 1870, at Tucson, age 38, occupation - U. S. Mail Carrier, property valued at \$750; on September 16, 1872, he became a dairyman at Tucson by renting from Peter B. Bain and Marion T. Beckwith, 20 milch cows, 20 young calves, a bull and 9 two-year old heifers; an appraisal of his state made

on July 23, 1873, shows that at the time of his death he had possession of 38 cows valued at \$25 each, 15 yearlings worth \$7 each, 20 hens at 50 cents each, 2 horses and 2 wagons appraised at \$200, with debts due him on his book for milk, \$217.22; the Probate Judge, W. J. Osborn, ordered that the rented livestock be delivered to Bain and Beckwith leaving to the estate 6 cows, 3 heifers, 3 bulls, 1 calf and 5 yearlings.

Died at his residence near Tucson, A.T., July 21, 1873, aged 41.
