Came to the Cadalen Purchase under employment of Don Manuel Candera, Governor of Sonora, 1854; was at Tubac, in 1858; listed, U.S. Census, 1860, at San Xavier, age 30, born in Connecticut; occupation, Barber; property valued at \$1,000; examined by a board of officers, 1st California Infantry, at Tucson, June 7, 1862, and left there June 10 with other political prisoners for Fort Yuma, arriving June 22; released from imprisonment, August 25, 1862; listed, Territorial Census, 1864, at Tucson, age 34, born in Connecticut, married, occupation, Clerk, resident in Arizona 10 years; listed, U.S. Census, 1870, at Tucson, age 40, born in Connecticut, occupation, Clerk in Store, property valued at \$1,200; listed in Berter's Tucson City Directory, 1881, occupation, Mining, 32 Church Street.
