Appointed from Maryland to West Point, 1832, graduated, 1836.

As Captain and Major, Staff, served as Chief Quartermaster for the Department of New Mexico from September 27, 1858 to September 30, 1862; participated in the battle of Valverde, New Mexico, February 21, 1862. Died at Baltimore, Maryland, November 4, 1885, aged 71.
